


## What are Tieks?


## Ties found







in wild, grassy, brushy, or forested areas, especially alongside trails.


Ticks wait at the end of a piece of grass or on logs until an animal or person brushes against them.














After the larva suck blood, they become a larger tick, called a nymph.




Nymphs suck blood from another small animal. Tick Life Cycle After the nymphs eat, they become adult ticks. Adult ticks look just like nymphs, but bigger.





When an adult tick is done feeding, it will lay eggs. The eggs will hatch into larva ticks and start the cycle all over again.




#### Protect yourself from ticks!



- Wear bug spray.
- Wear light-colored clothes because it is easier to see ticks on them.
- Wear long pants and a long-sleeved shirt.
- Tuck your pants into your socks or boots and tuck in your shirt.
- Stay on trails.

Timothy is sure to follow these tips to avoid getting bitten by ticks







After ticks get on an animal or a person they look for a good hiding place and so it is hard to see them.

#### After you go for a hike, or everyday if there are ticks where you play:

 Check everyone in your family for ticks.



 Ask your parents or another adult to help you do a tick check.

Check your pets very carefully. Ticks can be hard to see on animals with dark fur.

Timothy checks himself, Bullseye and other members of his family for ticks regularly.

## What do you do if you find a tick stuck to your body?

#### ANSWER:

Remove it quickly and properly.

An adult can help you get the tick out of your skin with tweezers.

#### How to remove a tick:



1. Grab the tick close to your skin with the tweezers or a tissue and pull straight out.

- 2. Wash where the tick bit you.
- 3. Wash your hands.
- 4. If you get sick after a tick bite you should go to the doctor.
