The types of modifications to approved plans and specifications that would need to be reviewed and approved by our office are outlined in Rule .0306 (highlighted below). Any other types of modifications could be noted within the certification for the project if the deviations do not affect capacity, hydraulic conditions, etc. per Rule .0306. Deviations requiring approval per Rule .0306 (which appears to be the case from the revised layout information provided) would need to be submitted similarly to the original project: In triplicate (one hard copy and 2 CDs or 3 hard copies), including an "Application for Approval...", a \$75 review fee for other construction or alteration to a distribution system as well as any revised plan sheets, specifications, engineers report, etc. (or documentation that original specifications, engineer's report, etc. were unchanged from the original). Our review timeframe is 30 days; however, we do typically try to expedite modifications to previously approved projects if possible. Documentation within the application that it is a project revision will help our administrative staff in entering the project correctly.

15A NCAC 18C .0306 CHANGES IN ENGINEERING PLANS OR SPECIFICATIONS AFTER APPROVAL Deviations from the approved engineering plans and specifications or changes in site conditions affecting capacity, hydraulic conditions, operating units, the functioning of water treatment processes, the quality of water to be delivered, or any provisos stipulated in the Department's original and subsequent letters of approval must be approved by the Department before any construction or installation. Revised engineering plans and specifications shall be submitted in time to permit the review and approval of such plans or specifications before any construction work affected by such deviations is begun. The Secretary may seek

injunctive relief under G.S. 130A-18, assess an administrative penalty under G.S. 130A-22(b), or revoke or suspend engineering plan approval under G.S. 130A-23 for any violation of this Rule.

To The Above Named Person and Entity,

This office has reviewed the subject erosion and sedimentation control plan. We find the plan to be acceptable and hereby issue this Letter of Approval. The enclosed Certificate of Approval must be posted at the job site. This plan approval shall expire two (2) years following the date of approval, if no land-disturbing activity has been undertaken.

Section 10 (1) of the Chatham County Sedimentation and Erosion Control Ordinance requires that a copy of the approved erosion control plan be on file at the job site. Also, this letter gives the notice required by G.S. 113A-61.1(a) of our right of periodic inspection to insure compliance with the approved plan.

North Carolina's Sedimentation Pollution Control Act is performance-oriented, requiring protection of existing natural resources and adjoining properties. If, following the commencement of this project, the erosion and sedimentation control plan is inadequate to meet the requirements of the Chatham County Sedimentation and Erosion Control Ordinance, this office may require revisions to the plan and implementation of the revisions to insure compliance with the Act.

Acceptance and approval of this plan is conditioned upon your compliance with Federal and State water quality laws, regulations, and rules. In addition, local city or county ordinances or rules may

Please be aware that your project will be covered by the enclosed NPDES General Stormwater Permit NCGO1000 (Construction Activities). You should first become familiar with all of the requirements for compliance with the enclosed general permit.

Please note that this approval is based in part on the accuracy of the information provided in the Financial Responsibility Form, which you provided. You are requested to file an amended form if there is any change in the information included on the form. Please notify us when you would like to schedule a preconstruction conference. Notification shall be given at least 7 days prior to initiation of activity.
