Jason,

I noticed that the Planning Department has received a preliminary plat approval request for Section X, Phase D. I will be out of town on the day of the meeting and wanted to submit a comment on their plan. I was not sure who I should submit my comment to, so I am sending it directly to you so that you can refer it to the appropriate Planner. A suggestion, it might be a good idea to include the Planner's contact information in the rezoning request so that people will know who to send comments to.

My comment is specific to what appears to be a walking path to be constructed along Millcroft. I say "appears" because on the drawings I did not see it designated as a walking path. Maybe I just missed it.

Walking paths are critical additions that should be included along all major streets in Fearington Village. This past April, one of our residents was hit and killed while walking along the street after pickup up their mail at the mail kiosk.

I am asking that the Planning Department require the extension of the existing walking path from the Millcroft mail kiosk all the way to Weathersfield at the time that the Millcroft road is extended to West Camden Circle and when West Camden is extended to Weathersfield. In addition, I am asking that this path be extended along Weathersfield to join another existing walking path that leads from Galloway Ridge along Millcroft.
