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Ordinance of the Chatham County Board of Commissioners

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION ORDINANCE OF CHATHAM COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Chatham County Board of Commissioners has considered a request to amend the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the text amendment set forth in the Application and incorporated herein by reference, if approved, would maintain Chatham County’s eligibility to remain in the National Flood Insurance Program. Furthermore, the aforementioned text amendment would protect human life and health, minimize expenditure of public money for costly flood control projects, and support all of the other objectives listed in Article 3, Section B, of the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Commissioners of Chatham County as follows:

1. The Application to amend the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance is approved as provided in Attachment A.
2. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.

ATTACHMENT "A"

SECTION B. BASIS FOR ESTABLISHING THE AREAS OF SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD.

-The Special Flood Hazard Areas are those identified under the Cooperating Technical State (CTS) agreement between the State of North Carolina and FEMA in its FIS dated [October 19, 2018](#) ~~November 17, 2017~~ for Chatham County and associated DFIRM panels, including any digital data developed as part of the FIS, which are adopted by reference and declared a part of this ordinance. Future revisions to the FIS and DFIRM panels that do not change flood hazard data within the jurisdictional authority of Chatham County are also adopted by reference and declared a part of this ordinance. Subsequent Letter of Map Revisions (LOMRs) and/or Physical Map Revisions (PMRs) shall be adopted within 3 months.
