David and I looked at the site on 8 April 2015. The updated maps are consistent with my site notes from the visit. These updated maps will be used for the final jurisdictional determination.

Do you still need/want an Approved Jurisdictional Determination (AJD) or would a Preliminary Jurisdictional Determination (PJD) suffice? If an AJD is required, I will need to get additional AJD forms (Rapanos Forms) for the tributaries. Only one AJD form was submitted with the application package. This site would require a total of six (6). Each intermittent tributary would need a separate form.

Please let me know which one you need and I will try to get it out ASAP. Thanks.
