Put in Mixed Recycling



Aluminum and Steel Cans

Empty and rinse.



Cardboard Boxes

Empty and dry. Flatten.



Paper

Office paper, newspaper, paper boxes, magazines, cartons, and paperback books.

Nothing smaller than a Post-it.



Plastic Bottles, Jugs, Jars, and Tub

Bottles, jugs, and jars have a neck smaller than the base.

Tubs have a plastic lid you can put back on.

Empty and rinse. Leave caps and lids on. Remove pumps.

When in doubt, throw it out!

DO NOT put in Mixed Recycling



Glass bottles & jars must go in the Glass Recycling*



No plastic bags*



No to-go containers



No aluminum trays or foil*



No bulky plastics



Never bag your recyclables



No cups



No shredded paper or paper towels



No hoses or other tangles



No hazardous containers*
