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A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE DIVISION OF DUTIES OF THE FLOODPLAIN ADMINISTRATOR AND THE WATERSHED ADMINISTRATOR

WHEREAS, the Chatham County Board of Commissioners has transferred the Watershed Review Board duties from the Planning Board to the Environmental Review Board; and

WHEREAS, the Board appointed the County Manager or his designee as the Watershed Administrator; and

WHEREAS, the Sustainable Communities Development Department Director has reviewed and recommends Exhibit A, "Division of Duties and Responsibilities between the Planning Director and the Environmental Resources Director as the Chatham County Floodplain Administrator and the Watershed Administrator", dated July 22, 2009; and

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Commissioners of Chatham County as follows:

- 1. The division of duties and responsibilities of the Floodplain Administrator and the Watershed Administrator is implemented as stated in Exhibit A.
- 2. This resolution shall become effective upon its adoption.

Staff Recommendations for the

Division of Duties and Responsibilities between the Planning Director (PD) and the Environmental Resources Director (ERD) as the Chatham County Floodplain Administrator and the Watershed Administrator

Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance- Floodplain Administrator duties and responsibilities

The ERD will generally perform the following listed duties based on professional experience, professional engineering licensure (PE) in the State of North Carolina and certification as a Certified Floodplain Administrator (CFM):

- 1. Technical issues related to established base flood elevations and proposed development activity such as floodproofing structures, regulatory floodplain and floodway encroachments and conditional letters of map changes and revisions (LOMC, LOMA and LOMR) issues, hydrologic and hydraulic model reviews and other technical reviews and approvals requiring the practice of professional engineering.
- 2. Variance issues involving technical or engineering reviews and recommendations.

The PD will perform all other non-engineering (day-to-day) review and permitting activities not requiring #1 and #2 above.

Watershed Protection Ordinance- Watershed Administrator duties and responsibilities

The ERD will generally perform the following listed duties based on professional experience, and certificates of training in wetlands identification and delineation and stream and surface water identification for riparian buffer rules.

- 1. Technical issues requiring a hearing of the Watershed Review Board, unless an appeal is from county actions, where the ERD and PB will address it jointly.
- 2. Address Section 304 issues including but not limited to making and/or reviewing onsite riparian buffer determinations for new development and re-development applications.
- 3. Review and determine non-residential watershed requests as they relate to impervious surface calculations and other stormwater related issues.

- 4. Section 305 where there is uncertainty with respect to the interpretation of a watershed area boundary.
- 5. Remedies and other recommendations to the Watershed Review Board.

The PD will generally perform the following balance of duties to include but not be limited to:

- 1. Review and make determinations concerning residential development issues and permit applications.
- 2. Review and make determinations of land use within the watershed areas.
- 3. Review and make determinations related to watershed area boundary determinations that are not in question or with uncertainty.
