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#### 4. Announcements and updates from ERAC members

- **JA:** Started group discussion about DEQ Public Hearing on Cape Fear Station Ash Basin Closure Plan coal ash meeting (2/12/20) and asked if anyone who attended could summarize what was discussed during the meeting.
  - o **SG:** Attended the meeting.
    - Asked about monitoring for heavy metals. The presenter said there was nothing in the application for monitoring heavy metals.
    - There were also questions about the de-watering process of the ash and whether it would go to a wastewater site to be cleaned before being discharged into a nearby river. The presenters said the water will be reduced to 25% before being trucked and processed.
    - Another question was asked about whether more coal ash would be brought into Chatham County for processing. <u>RT</u>: Informed ERAC that there will not be additional coal ash brought in from other county sites.
- EC: Updated the group on the Haw River Assembly (HRA) lawsuit against Burlington.
  - O Burlington is now doing more monitoring and they recognize that there is a problem with their system. The HRA does believe there is progress with the discussions that have come about since the initial notice of intent to sue. Both parties have learned more about what is occurring with the wastewater treatment plant in Burlington.

- We can expect more updates as they become available to the public.
- RB: Discussed the new changes from the EPA regarding the Waters of the US Rules

  - The changes are expected to reduce federal jurisdiction over wetlands and surface waters.
  - The finalized policy change was put forward by EPA in January 2020, but has not been fully implemented.
