SNRCS

NRCS provides technical assistance in the form of conservation planning. Conservation planning is a voluntary process that helps landowners develop a customized record of their natural resources and how those resources are utilized on farming operations, forested lands and wildlife habitats. It interprets the capabilities and limitations of the land for meeting landowner objectives. Conservation technical assistance addresses opportunities, concerns, and problems related to the use of natural resources and to help land users make sound natural resource management decisions.

NRCS offers financial and technical assistance through conservation practices, activities and enhancements to help agricultural producers make and maintain improvements on their land.



Present Use Value Program

Your farmland (agricultural, horticultural and/or forestland) may qualify for the Present Use Value Program which defers the market-value property tax rates based on several qualifying factors.

Personal property taxes are applied to the value of unregistered motor vehicles (such as cars without state tags and registration) as well as any equipment used to produce income. For businesses, it covers any farm equipment used to produce income.
