2-year funding cycle

- Denise spoke at length about how this would work
- Mike and Peggy gave arguments for why it might be best to stay on a 1-year cycle, for now

Request for Proposals

- The new RFP was created after a meeting of the Risk and Needs Committee on October 22nd
- MOTION to accept the new RFP by Troy; second by Peggy; no abstentions; none opposed

Program/DJJ Updates

Family Advocacy – Fatima Beck

- Currently 8 youth in program; 6 of them fall under "Raise the Age"
- Offering parenting classes, one-on-one support, and youth planning conferences
- Mentoring sessions take place Wednesday and Thursday in 3-hour sessions; 4 youth taking advantage of this service with 2 more ready to start

Community Service and Restitution – Ramiro Martinez

- Have served 19 youth; 6 are currently in the program; 1 falls under "Raise the Age"
- Community service continues to consist of home projects and reflection papers

<u>Teen Court – Pablo Avendano</u>

- Have served 7 youth, so far, of 38 projected
- Still conducting restorative circles online, once a month

- Training volunteers to serve as community representatives
- Educational seminars are being conducted via Zoom

<u>Haven House – Patricia Cardoso</u>

- Have had an increase in referrals in general, but not Chatham
- Only had 1 referral at this time last year
- Admin offices are relocating from downtown Raleigh ~ February

El Futuro – Kerry Brock

- Have served 5 youth, so far; 3 are new and 2 are carry-overs from 19/20
- Still using telehealth, but moving toward in-person sessions in Durham
- Seeing a lot of need for financial/food/eviction assistance, other basic needs
- July and August saw requests for services double

Department of Public Safety Update

Juvenile Justice Statistics

- 18 complaints and 11 youth intakes for Sept and Oct
- Raise the Age numbers have exceeded projections; this is largely due to out-of-county youth alcohol violations at Jordan Lake

Final Accounting

- All final accounting information has been submitted
- Psychological Assessments gave a refund

Policy Changes

Programs will receive training from Denise on SPEP scoring

Announcements

- Training on Race and Trauma, phase 1, will occur on November 12th, Stephanie will send out flyer
- Chatham County has been awarded a grant to start a Family Treatment Court (court-supervised substance use treatment program)
- Judge Murrell mentioned that the Chatham County Schools will roll out mobile internet connection buses
- George has plenty of medication disposal packets to distribute as needed
- · Renita emphasized the importance of working together, as a network, to address client needs
- Mike Zelek noted that COVID cases are at record highs and precautions are as important as ever
- CIS has capacity for more referrals
