

RESOLUTION

Recognizing the Seattle Men's Chorus

For Program to Benefit the HIV/AIDS Council of Chatham County

WHEREAS, the Chatham County HIV/AIDS Council has worked for seven years to support and develop strategies that will reduce behaviors which put persons at risk for HIV and AIDS and to promote the support and care of Chatham residents affected by HIV and AIDS; and

WHEREAS, the Chatham County HIV/AIDS Council has three specific goals: 1) to raise awareness among all ages and all cultures about how to prevent HIV and AIDS; 2) to train and involve leaders in churches, communities, schools, businesses, and organizations to educate others about HIV and AIDS; and 3) to provide support services and links to services for people in Chatham living with HIV/AIDS; and
