- Chatham Park on Map? Small key map on p. 29 + FLU map label & outline
 - Added to FLU and Conservation Map and added a small key map for the Chatham Park callout in the issues and opportunities section.
- Farmland Preservation Plan and Chatham Conservation plan should be highlighted, referenced and have an action to update/adopt
 - Added text to narrative that describes relationship to Agricultural Land Use Plan
 - Added a strategy (2.4) to "Update and adopt the Farmland Preservation Plan which includes additional land use recommendations to preserve agricultural operations in the county."
 - Also added strategy and action item to "Evaluate and update real estate notification precedures to include a Real Estate Transfer Disclosure Statement in areas near established Voluntary Agricultural Districts (VADs), in Agricultural Areas identified on the Future Land Use and Conservation Map and/or near other designated working lands."
- HiAD approach new DEFINE
 - Added text and definition of HiAP to Health Element narrative.
- Public health priority area EXPLAIN
 - Revised text in call out box
- ROI -> Government dollars spent or cost of services return... reword
 - Title Changed from "Return on Investment for Land Use Types" to "Revenue for Every Dollar of Public Services by Land Use Type"
- Action Items Clarify steps toward open space Goal/Big Idea (Resources or money needed)
 - Added a direct recommendation and action item to "Study the establishment of a
 - county-led land acquisition program public to assist in local land protection efforts."
- Chart or metric needed for Als
 - Added Chart and metrics to action items sections.
- Make design guidelines (can update) an action item

- Residual tax base will not support plan.

 - Added text to action item related to a recognition program.

 - All policies flow from water
 - Added sentence to issues and opportunities section: "Protecting water quality was identified as a shared goal and driving force behind land use, natural resources and agricultural recommendations."
- Big ideas too little detail all sections
- Need metric for how much farmland (gross acreage? Area of agriculture?)
- Haw river and Mount Gilead road
 - More about preservation of rural character here especially with 15-501 'urbanization'
- Preserve rural land though 50% preservation may be too high for some, consider that 'protection' is public and private effort and comes in various forms clarify ... incentivize
- Preserve function and economic opportunity of 15 -501
- Jobs big idea goal
 - Ambitious ... good!
 - Relate to workforce population projections and perhaps include (>10k)
 - Don't include out commuting
 - Keeping it at 10k for now. Would still move the needle on jobs to housing balance and would begin to reverse trends.
- Better reference to DOT's CTP
 - \circ $\;$ Added some language for this.
- Transit intergovernmental agreements for cost sharing
 - Added a strategy.
- Recognition of Cary's role and responsibility (partner with county)
- Agriculture major is actually protection & growth (conflict does not equal MAJ)
 - Modified narrative text to be more clear.
- Include the Chatham County agriculture and Land Use plan (2009) and REC adoption of it with some updates
- Water issues 'watered down'
 - Added text to Agriculture narrative and added a strategy: "Consider impacts of new development on ground and surface water resources during development approval process."
 - Also added an action item to "Evaluate develoment approval processes, conditional use and rezoning requirements in Agricultural Areas to include consideration of impacts on ground and surface water resources."

Other Edits Made

- Changed out images to include images from Chatham Cooperative Extension.
- Added quote to Farmers Concerns call out regarding land costs and infrastructure.
- New strategy and Action Item based on department of permitting priorities: Provide training for staff to increase capacity to review and permit LEED buildings, alternative energy systems, green stormwater infrastructure (GSI) and other innovative building methods.
- Added policy, strategies and action item related to solid waste and recycling.
- Added action item for county joint water/sewer plan (priority of Public Works)
