

A RESOLUTION INCREASING THE NUMBER, AND PROVIDING FOR TERMS OF OFFICE AND FOR STAGGERING TERMS OF OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE GOLDSTON-GULF SANITARY DISTRICT BOARD

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Goldston-Gulf Sanitary District consists of a sanitary district board of three members, all of whom are elected simultaneously for two year terms; and

WHEREAS, the said governing body, by Resolution adopted on November 5, 1997, has requested the Board of County Commissioners of Chatham County to increase the number of members from three to five, to provide for the staggering of their terms, and to increase the length of terms from two to four years, and

WHEREAS, Section 130A-50 of the General Statutes of North Carolina empowers the Board of County Commissioners to provide for staggered terms, to fix the number of members of sanitary boards at either three or five members, and to fix the length of terms of said members at either two or four years.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Chatham County, North Carolina as follows:

1. That the number of members of the Goldston-Gulf Sanitary District Board is hereby expanded from three to five members, effective with the next regularly scheduled election of members.
2. That the members now in office as members of the Goldston-Gulf Sanitary District Board, and their successors, elected at the next regularly scheduled election of members after the adoption of this Resolution shall serve four year terms beginning with the election to take place in 1999.
3. That the members elected in 1999 to fill the two additional seats created hereby shall serve two year terms so as to provide for staggered terms. Thereafter, all members of said board shall be elected for four year, staggered terms, with three members being elected in 1999 and each four years thereafter, and with two members being elected in 2001 and each four years thereafter.
4. All resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
5. This Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption.

Commissioner Grimes introduced and moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution. Commissioner Wilson seconded the motion. The resolution was adopted at a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Chatham County on the 17th day of

November , 1997, by a vote of 5 ayes and 0 nays.
