The subject parcel was part of the Joshua W. Hackney farm, which in the mid- to late-1800s encompassed over 400 acres. Hackney was born in 1820, and in 1837 his father John Hackney sold him over 270 acres of his extensive holdings in Williams and Baldwin Townships. Four years later, his father gave him four slaves – a woman (Revas), a boy (Lewis), and two girls (Jane and Milley). In 1840, Joshua added 131 more acres to the farm, and soon he and his wife Harriet (Hill) began a large family, which came to include sons John Joseph, Malcolm Seaton, Littleberry M., and Edward Carney, and two daughters – Sarah Elizabeth and Texanna. Joshua married his second wife, Harriette (Griffin), in 1882, and they had a son Wm Floyd (or Lloyd Thaxton) Hackney in 1889. Joshua Hackney died in 1892, and in his will he made provisions for his widow and young son to have the "Home place" – the subject parcel and more.

The next year (1893), a Commissioner appointed by the Chatham County Supreme Court awarded most of the Joshua Hackney estate to William A. Foushee, who was married to Hackney's daughter Texanna. Harriet appears to have continued to occupy the property (the fate of her son is unknown). In 1916, Wm Foushee left the property and more to Meredith College of Wake County, which held the 550-acre parcel until 1943, when it was sold to Kemp B. Cole of Orange County. Cole soon began to subdivide the property, and in 1945 sold the 57-acre subject property to his daughter LaRue Cole Tripp and her husband Roy. Following LaRue's death in 2003, the Tripp family sold the property to Contentnea Creek Development Company.

In addition to the 4 slaves given by John Hackney to his son Joshua in 1841, it can be inferred that scores more lived and died on this land, and are buried beneath its soils. The Chatham County Historical Association estimates that about 100 graves may be located on the property:
