The cemetery behind the church was a part of the 80 AC. The cemetery was subdivided away initially in 1912. The cemetery is not located on the Firefly Overlook parcel.

The PB 11 PG 82 Map

(1968) would have referenced the survey if it was still within the residual 65 AC. It had been cut out in 1912 but officially conveyed in 1951 (because the 1912 deed was not signed by both parties. This seems very straight forward to me. Let me know if you have any further questions regarding this matter.

Mark, please see attached documents to be used as a reference on this topic.

- DB H-G Pg 263 describes 80 acres to Williams, and excepts a ½ acre area for a graveyard whose location is not described. The deed does not contain plottable bearings and distances, but rather references boundaries to roads that no longer exist, and historic adjoining property owners without deed references.
- PB 11 PG 82 best illustrates the description contained in DB H-G Pg 263; the Williams parcels are depicted as Lots 5, 6, 7, 8. Firefly Overlook occupies the eastern area of Lot 8. Although not shown, the area of an existing cemetery is within Lot 4 roughly in the area you've circled below, and well away from the Firefly Overlook acreage.
- DB K-Y, Pg 30 describes a +/- half-acre area from Williams to the Baptist Church in the area you've circled below Pleasant Hill Baptist Cemetery. Although the true location of the cemetery in DB H-G, Pg 263 is not described, I would presume that the cemetery area described in DB K-Y, Pg. 30 is the one referenced.



On behalf of the Chatham County Historical Association, I would like to reiterate my Sept. 23, 2022 comments on the Firefly Overlook site:

- 1. The only National Register site in the area indicated in the HPOWEB database—the James A. Thomas Farm—would not be expected to be impacted by the proposed project.
- 2. Ownership of the subject parcels was traced back to the late 1800s to the Mitchell, Ellis, and Moore families. No structures or activities are indicated in the deed histories, although the presence of a ½-acre graveyard is indicated for the 80-acre tract encompassing parcel #17531 in a 1934 deed (H-G/263).
- 3. No houses related to these families are shown on the 1870 Ramsey map, although a structure labelled "Bethel" is indicated in the general area. Lot #17531 was part of a 2-year timber deed in 1976, and Lot #18070 was leased for timbering in 1993; both lots appear disturbed in the 1997 aerials, which show (timber?) roads, and a possible small structure on the west side of Lot #17531.
- 4. Care should be taken prior to and during development to look for traces of the graveyard and other structures, as well as for artifacts along old Raleigh road and Big Branch that comprise the north side of Lot #18070, and the unnamed branch on the southeast corner of Lot #17531.
- 5. If it has not already been done, a cultural resources assessment by a trained archaeologist would be desirable as part of the EIA.
