Location description: <u>The project site is approximately 51 acres located south of Millcroft Drive, near the town of Pittsboro,</u> Chatham County North Carolina, and is identified by PIN 95264.

The Corps of Engineers believes that there may be jurisdictional aquatic resources in the review area, and the requestor of this PJD is hereby advised of his or her option to request and obtain an approved JD (AJD) for that review area based on an informed decision after having discussed the various types of JDs and their characteristics and circumstances when they may be appropriate.
- 2.
