APPENDIX C: SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL LOT GUIDELINES FOR STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

The practices below are required for better lot design with regard to managing stormwater runoff from single-family residential uses. Chatham County requires the use of one or more of these practices to reduce total runoff quantity and quality from a lot. It also serves to limit negative impacts to downstream or offsite property in terms of scour, sedimentation, flooding or other potential damages.

Single Family Residential Lots

At least one of the following design standards shall be utilized in the development or redevelopment of an individual lot for a single family residence:

i. All roof downspouts shall discharge onto the surface of the natural ground at-least 25 feet from the property boundary and in accordance with all applicable Building Codes ;

ii. Collect the first $\frac{1}{2}$ " equivalent runoff volume from at-least 1/2 of the total roof area by connecting downspouts to operating rain barrels or cisterns;

iii. Driveways, walkways and patios shall drain into well-maintained landscaped beds using native vegetation and amended soils.
