Hi Luke--

Thanks for sending the information about the Hamlet's Chapel subdivision. We do have a few questions.

Did your consultants look for evidence of old homesteads on the property? We would like to document the locations, even if there are just ruins. We also would like to document the coordinates for old road traces if any are found.

The consultant memo says that they consulted the Wake County soil survey. I assume they meant the Chatham County soil survey. What did that map suggest about the use of the property in the 1930s? Did the consultant check the 1938 aerial for the property? It appears to show some kind of homestead, or structures. We would like to know if any evidence of those structures, or artifacts associated with them, still remain. See attached clip from the 1938 aerial file.

Would you be willing to share with us a copy of the consultant's report on the search for cemeteries? Do you have something that gives more details about the methodology used to examine the property than what is provided in the memo? We don't expect GPR to be used, but we would like to know how much of the property was looked at and, if possible, where they looked.

As you probably know, we have an estimated location for the Thomas Foushee cemetery on nearby parcel 2037. According to descendants, the homeplace was near the cemetery. We are working to arrange an outing to try to locate the cemetery and fully document it. If we are successful, we will have additional information confirming that the cemetery is not on the parcels you intend to develop. Our early location estimates were made without the benefit of GPS technology and can be off by quite a bit, so we are eager to get a precise location for the site.

We also hope you will share your title trail on the property, and we may want to suggest some ways that the history of the property could be honored, such as with road names.

We appreciate your efforts to ensure that there are no cemeteries on the property prior to your beginning work. If any historic features are identified as you move forward (ruins, road traces, wells, etc), please let us know. We would like the opportunity to photograph and document what is there and will get out of your way as quickly as possible.




Fallen Structure 1 – (North)




Fallen Structure 2 – (West)

On November 13, 2023, S&EC personnel traversed the Hamlet's Chapel Road property located south of Hamlet's Chapel Road (PINS: 2035; 1806; & 95989) in Pittsboro, Chatham County, NC. The purpose of this site visit was to look for visual evidence of existing cemeteries. Visual evidence would include things such as headstones or grave markers of any kind (e.g., vertical rocks placed in a pattern), fenced or walled areas, depressions in the ground, or any other obvious evidence indicating a cemetery. This survey did not include ground penetrating radar (GPR) or other more detailed methods.

Prior to the site visit, S&EC reviewed historical aerial photos of the site, USGS topographic maps, and the Wake County USDA soil survey. We also reviewed available online cemetery survey records and the Cemetery Census. These records did not identify any historical indications of a cemetery on the property.

Based on the field inspection of the property and review of these historical data sources, no evidence was found to suggest the presence, or likely historical presence, of a cemetery at the site. If unmarked human skeletal remains are encountered during construction, the provisions of North Carolina General Statute Chapter 70, Article 3 apply. Construction activities should immediately cease, and the county medical examiner should be contacted.
